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Minimum Noise enables musicians to collaborate and make money

The newly launched web site Minimum Noise - <http://www.minimumnoise.com> - allows musicians to use *crowdsourcing* in their musical productions. You can use it to complete your music with the talent of somebody on the other side of the world. Or you can use it to make profit from your production talents by helping others.

This means that you can have somebody make the bassline, beats or vocals for your music while you focus on the things that you are best at. Or, you can make money helping somebody else with their music if they are requesting something that you do well.

The site has been up since December 22nd so it's fairly new. However, we are already seeing some interesting and experimental work appear.

It's inspired by similar concepts from the design world, such as www.crowdspring.com and www.logosauce.com. You create a "project" describing the kind of audio you are requesting, and the prize that you are willing to pay. Producers participate and when you hear something you like, you declare that producer to be the winner. Then, the money is exchanged for the audio along with the rights.

So in essence, this enables you to make music with the help of people from the other side of the world - and it helps musicians make money doing what they love, even if they aren't a big name.
